



Certified Pedestrian Safety Professional (CPSP) 1-Day Training Course



In several cities, it is common to use individuals to control pedestrian traffic in public streets during special events and other temporary activities. Often, these individuals (i.e., retired police and or retired law enforcement officers) do not have the necessary training to perform this temporary traffic control (TTC) function safely and within the standards and guidelines contained in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD). This course is intended to fill this void to ensure the continuity and consistency of pedestrian and traffic management services.

Program Objective: To provide individuals responsible for managing pedestrian traffic on public streets with the training necessary to provide for the safe and efficient movement of pedestrians and their own safety.
